SIMON AND CHRIS'S TOP PRIORITIES

- 1) Keeping neighbourhood facilities open**
With Conservative austerity cuts ongoing, we're likely to need more of Simon Bull's successful campaigns which have saved public toilets in Winton Rec and town centre.
- 2) Cherish Winton's green spaces, don't close them**
Prioritise our green space, re-open Winton Library Gardens.
- 3) NO new oil drilling off Bournemouth Beach – instead our council must recognise the climate emergency.**
- 4) Action on empty homes** – Pressure the council to act on Bournemouth's 1,000 empty homes and soaring rents.
- 5) Better parking, better transport** – Push the council to improve management of Winton's scarce parking. Protect and improve public transport, cycle routes, road surfaces.
- 6) Keep listening to, helping and informing residents**




PARKING ENFORCEMENT: COUNCILLOR SIMON BULL REPORTS BACK

Councillor Simon Bull has had a response from Bournemouth Council's traffic department to the Winton resident concerns reported in our March edition. They state that mobile parking monitoring and enforcement are in place in Winton, and they will respond to complaints from residents. Parking on a corner is a police (not council) matter if no double yellow line.

Simon says: "I'll continue to monitor the parking situation in Winton. **If you have any concerns or comments** about local parking, please do contact me using the details below."
