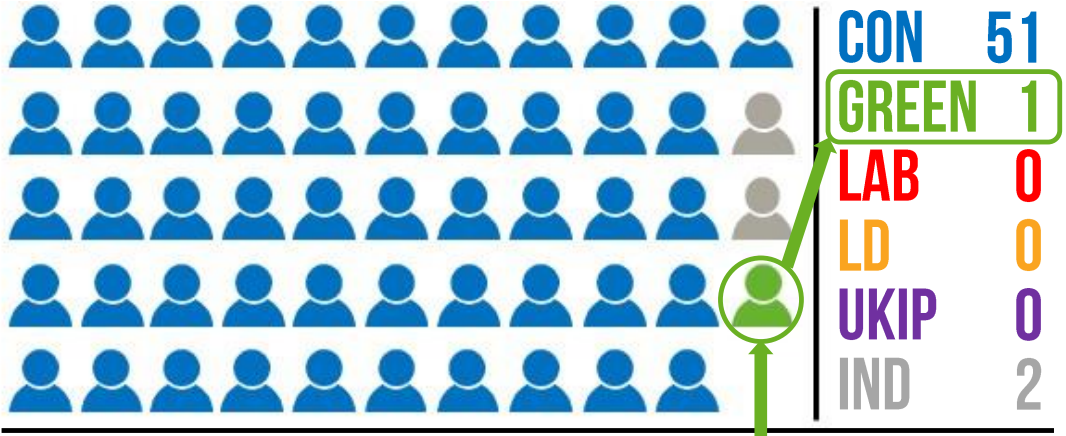

Makeup of Bournemouth Council Nov 2018

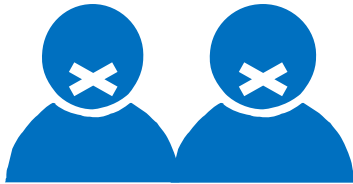
