With a reputation for being hands-on, Nicole is an experienced and independent community support campaigner and organiser. She has a long track record of working actively in her local community and across BCP: with grassroots charities, the Southern Ambulance Services, and the 2018 introduction of the successful Cycling Without Age into the area.
