Here in Moordown, we have campaigned for safer streets: almost 200 local residents signed our petition to the Council for a new pedestrian crossing on Charminster Road serving local schools, and we are setting up a Community Speed Watch initiative on West Way to tackle dangerous driving. We are pressing the Council to take tougher action on dog fouling and fly-tipping, and we have reported numerous potholes and instances of vandalism and graffiti — these have been rectified.

By voting for us at the election on Thursday May 4<sup>th</sup>, we'll be able to take even more action on the issues that are important to you. We would be honoured to serve as your representatives on BCP Council, and to speak up for you and for Moordown.
