# QUEEN'S PARK ADVENTURE PLAY AREA TO BE RENEWED AFTER £73,000 GRANT SECURED

- Cllr Alasdair Keddie's work helps win funds to replace condemned play equipment
- Successful collaboration will bring improved facilities and surrounding environment

The Woodpecker Play Area in Queen's Park is set to be renewed, with a £73,000 grant secured from the Veolia Environmental Trust. The project will include new play equipment, improved facilities, and enhancements to the surrounding environment — making Queen's Park an even better place for our community to come together.

Hard-working local Green Councillor Alasdair Keddie identified a suitable grant fund to apply to, and worked with the Queen's Park & Charminster Neighbourhood Charity and BCP Council's Greenspace Team to get the successful application in motion. The Neighbourhood Charity's survey to local residents on the site's future received 200 responses within days.

The existing wooden adventure play area installation has sadly **largely expired long before its intended use-by date.** Large parts of it are **boarded up** and **no longer safe.** The **impact has been deeply felt by families** in our local area.

This came after staff at **severely cash-strapped BCP Council** had indicated to Alasdair they **could not foot the entire cost** of renewing the playground at this time. However, **securing the grant will kickstart the project earlier**, with a **major financial contribution from the Council** as part of their **Plan for Play**.

Alasdair says: "The grant is a great win for our community!"

## **ALASDAIR KEDDIE ELECTED CHAIR OF DORSET POLICE & CRIME PANEL**

Role will hold Police & Crime Commissioner to account in meeting policing priorities

Alasdair Keddie commented: "Lines of enquiry at the Dorset Police & Crime Panel can lead to real change for the whole county. As its Chair I have called for:

- Improved police reporting for our communities.
- A clear roadmap for **dealing with the crack, heroin and opiate crisis** in BCP.
- A Violence Reduction Unit to tackle knife crime and serious violence.
- Retaining daily visible policing patrols at hotspots in the county including in Charminster and Winton.
- A fairer deal on police funding for Dorset."

## **NEW QUEEN'S PARK COMMUNITY GARDEN COMING INTO BLOOM**

#### First project supported by relaunched community charity after Alasdair Keddie's groundwork

Last year, local volunteers successfully took over the management of an unloved patch of land near Queen's Park. They envisioned a haven for biodiversity and pollinators, and a facility for the whole community.

This Community Garden was the first project supported by the newly relaunched Queen's Park & Charminster **Neighbourhood Charity**, after new local trustees stepped up. Reviving the charity was one of Alasdair Keddie's key goals after being elected. Alasdair also directly helped the Community Garden get off the ground, by negotiating BCP Council's transfer of open space to **community ownership**.

Alasdair says: "We kickstarted the Garden with plants and flowers rescued from the sadly closed King's Park Nursery, with further donations from the community. As we go in to Spring, it's beginning to burst with life, with the first flush of daffodils, tulips and bluebells coming in to bloom. The garden continues to evolve with a wildlife pond, bug hotels, a 'dead hedge' and other wildlife-friendly features."

## **MAJOR PROGRESS IN REDUCING CHARMINSTER'S NIGHTLIFE VIOLENCE**

- Alasdair Keddie now BCP's Vice-Chair of Licensing
- Problem Charminster nightspot closed; hours reduced at two others

Hard-working local Green councillor Alasdair Keddie has been elected as Vice-Chair of BCP's decision-making councillors for venue licensing applications and reviews.

Alasdair commented: "The nighttime economy has been an early priority for me. In Charminster, we've seen anti-social behaviour escalating into serious violence, with irresponsibly run venues and breaches of licensing principles.

"However, a huge amount has been achieved in the last 18 months. One Charminster venue has had its licence revoked. Another has voluntarily reduced its hours. A third has had **restrictions placed** on its hours. The net result is reduced violence, and reduced impact on residents."

#### NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN UNDERWAY TO GIVE COMMUNITY MORE CONTROL AND INVESTMENT

Queen's Park & Charminster Neighbourhood Forum has started work on developing a Neighbourhood Plan.

Alasdair Keddie says: "A Neighbourhood Plan allows the community to take more control over planning decisions.

"We can set local policies saying we want to develop more affordable family homes, and fewer onebedroom flats and Houses in Multiple Occupation. "It'll also unlock increases in the levy we can charge developers to fund local community infrastructure."
