## MORE IMPROVEMENTS SECURED FOR TWO LOCAL PARKS

- Winton Library Gardens dividing fence removed
- New community infoboard coming to Fampoux Gardens

Hard-working local Green councillors Simon Bull and Chris Rigby arranged for the fence between the upper and lower sections of Winton Library Gardens to be removed. This follows last year's re-opening of the lower section of the Gardens [see previous issue] after years of work by Simon and Chris.

Meanwhile, a new community information board is on the way to Fampoux Gardens between Green Road and Firbank Road.

These improvements are being funded from **money allocated to our area** by **BCP Council's Ward Improvement Fund**.

Simon Bull commented: "Green spaces are so important for mental health, for play, for relaxation. Residents tell me how much they value each one in our area. It's our duty as councillors to continue to make sure the Council looks after them."

## ST ALBAN'S CHURCH COMMUNITY ROOM TO BE REDECORATED



Treasure, a community group who work to support local victims of domestic abuse, have secured funding from BCP Council's Ward Improvement Fund. They were supported in this by local Green councillors Simon Bull and Chris Rigby. This grant will be used to redecorate the community room they use at St Alban's Church on Linwood Road. It will also benefit other users of that space.

## **MORE TREE COVER ON WAY IN OUR AREA**

#### Over £21,000 secured for more street trees

Winton East currently has the lowest level of tree canopy cover — high branches offering shade — of any area in our conurbation.

Simon Bull and Chris Rigby have secured over £21,000, mostly Community Infrastructure funds [levied from developers], for more street trees in Winton. Winton will be the first beneficiary of BCP Council's forthcoming Urban Forest Strategy.

#### REPORTS OF PLAN TO REOPEN WINTON HEALTH CENTRE

Banks Medical Centre still open, after closure threat

Green Councillor Simon Bull has raised concerns about closures of local medical centres, forcing residents in our area to travel further to see a GP [see issue 23].

Now the *Bournemouth Daily Echo* reports that **Winton Health Centre** on **Alma Road**, where over 10,000 patients had been registered, **may reopen by next year** with **new NHS funding**.

Meanwhile, the proposed closure of Banks Medical Centre on Wimborne Road, with transfer of patient registrations to a site in Bearwood, has not taken place (at the time of going to press).

Simon said: "Cllr Rigby and I continue to monitor the adequacy of local residents' access to nearby GP services. We would welcome contact from residents."

### "NEVER AGAIN", SAYS SIMON BULL AT VE DAY CEREMONY

A Beacon Lighting Ceremony took place on the 80th anniversary of VE Day, at BCP Civic Centre.

Simon Bull spoke: "Imagine a world without victory in Europe - a world where tyranny triumphed, where darkness endured. [It] could have been ours - if not for the courage, the sacrifice, unbreakable resolve of those who stood against it. We remember them: those who fought, those who fell. Those who carried unbearable loss... They paid the price of our freedom.

"They came from every corner of the world, from every walk of life. From every faith, and none. Their strength was... in their unity across difference. That unity won the war.

"That unity must guide us still... We owe them more than remembrance. We owe them vigilance. We must stand against those who seek to divide, deceive and dominate. Their tools may be different today, but their aims are not. In honour of the fallen, and in defence of the future, we must say clearly: never again."
